4.0 REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION, SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY ON ITS FINDINGS ON THE STOPPAGE OF SUBVENTION OF TERTIARY INSTITUTIONS IN THE STATE

The House received the Report of the findings of Committee on Education, Science and Technology on its findings on the stoppage of subvention to tertiary institutions in the state as presented by Hon. J. Oyebamiji (Akinyele) on behalf of the Chairman.

Motion made, "that the House do receive the report as presented for debate" – Hon. O.A. Oyatokun (Afijio) Deputy Majority Leader

Motion seconded by Hon. J.O. Ojo (Oriire) Minority Leader

Question put and agreed to.

Debate Arising:

Question put and agreed to.

Resolved as follows, "that

- i) His Excellency Senator Abiola Ajimobi, be commended for graciously approving the restoration of twenty-five percent (25%) subventions to state-owned institutions. This signifies

that our amiable Governor is a listening, caring and passionate Governor on issues to public importance

- ii) The Executive Arm of Government should consider an upward review of the subventions to newly established institutions such as the College of Education, Lanlate, The Ibarapa Polytechnic, Eruwa and the Oke-Ogun Polytechnic, Saki, (where take off grant was not given); and
- iii) In view of the present economic reality in the State, the State owned Tertiary Institutions should be urged to be creative and innovative to diversify their revenue generating strategies, be prudent and plug all loopholes and be transparent by declaring all their revenue to government
- iv) Committee on Education, Science and Technology should continue to interact with all stakeholders for mutual resolution of the matter.

5.0 NEED TO CONTROL ALL TRUCKS IN TRANSIT TO ALWAYS COVER ITS LOAD COMPLETELY

Motion made, "That this Honourable House take a Critical look at the manner truck drivers transport their load uncovered with impunity and danger it portends to other road users with a view to correcting the inappropriate attitude" – Hon. J.O. Ojo, (Oriire), Minority Leader.

Motion seconded by Hon. J. Oyebamiji, (Akinyele II).

Debate arising:

Question put and agree to.

Resolved as follows: "that this Honourable House,

- i. Appeal to the Executive Arm of government to mandate the Department of Vehicle Inspectorate of the Ministry of Works and Transport to enforce effective covering of gravel, sand and refuse loaded by tipper lorries in the State.
- ii. Implore Tipper Drivers Association in the State to make it mandatory for all their members to always and properly cover the contents of their vehicles when in transit.
- iii. Appeal to other Relevant Federal Road Management Agencies such as Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC) to enforce this policy on all roads users that convey dangerous materials in the state; and
- iv. Invite the Commissioner for Environment Works and Transport (Directorate of Vehicle Inspectorate), Association of Refuse Collectors, Waste Management Authority and Association of Tipper Drivers to appear before the House on Tuesday, 22nd November, 2016 – for further deliberation
