6.0 MATTERS OF URGENT PUBLIC IMPORTANCE:

(i) Pursuant to Order VIII 4(1 - 4) of the Standing Rules of the Oyo State House of Assembly, Hon. J.O. Ojo (Oriire), Minority Leader raised a Matter of Urgent Public Importance on "Immense Suffering being experienced by the Drivers and Commuters on Oyo/Ogbomoso Road due to the deplorable state of the road.

(ii) Motion made that Order VIII 4(3) of the Standing Rules of Oyo State House of Assembly be suspended to enable the Matter of urgent Public Importance be debated: - Hon. P.O. Oyetunji (Surulere/Ogo-Oluwa).

Motion seconded by Hon. A.F. Adesina (Ibadan South-East I).

Question put and agreed to.

Debate commenced on the Substantive Matter.

By leave of Mr. Speaker, the matter was referred to Committee on Works and Transport for discussion with FERMA and report to the House.

7.0 APPEARANCE BEFORE THE HOUSE:

7.1 Pursuant to the Resolution of the House at its Sitting on Tuesday, 18th and Thursday, 20th October, 2016. The under-listed officials appeared before the House to brief the House on measures to be taken to reduce and discourage street begging and destitution with their attendant menace in the State.

(i) Chief Isaac A. Ishola - Commissioner for Environment and Water Resources;

(ii) Mr. Gbade O. Oguntola - Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Environment and Water Resources

In his presentation, the Commissioner for Environment and Water Resources informed the House that the Ministry of Environment and Water Resources has never reneged in the actualization of Keeping Oyo State Environment Clean and Save.

He informed the House that as a responsible Ministry and in the strength of the extant rules and regulations as contained in the

Environmental laws of Oyo State, numbers of steps have been taken towards realizing good environment, among which were:

- (i) maintaining a relationship with the Ministry of Women Affairs, Community Development, Social Welfare and Poverty Alleviation and all Local Government Councils in Oyo State on the matter. Both Ministries identified categorized elements of street-beggars as "the Destitute" and "the Professional Beggars" while the professional beggars are arranged to be re-oriented towards productive living. The destitutes on the other hand, are to be rehabilitated by the Government at the Rehabilitation Centre, Moniya. He said the action was on going and;
- (ii) that the Ministry has been engaging critical stakeholders, who are being used as Environmental Neighbourhood watch to assist in the "No Street Begging and Trading" Policy of Oyo State, the Commissioner thereafter, fielded questions from Honourable Members on issues ranging from implementation of enabling laws, execution of Government Policies on Environmental Preservation, activation of Tribunals, Resettlement and relocation of destitutes presently resident along Jemibewon Road.

By leave of the House, the Commissioner was directed to seriously look into the issue of destitution and other environmental distortion and take concrete actions which should be reported to the House on Tuesday, 6th December, 2016.

The Officials took their leave after three bows.

7.2 Pursuant to the Resolution of the House at its Sitting of Thursday, 20th October, 2016, the under-listed officials appeared before the House to brief the House on:

- (a) measures to ensure free flow of traffic on major roads in the State, particularly in Ibadan, the Capital City;
- (b) illegal road cutting at Beere and Mapo in Ibadan;
- (c) steps to be taken to clear hawkers and traders along roadsides in the State;
- (d) proffer safety measures on plying the roads by commuters, motorists, and commercial drivers:
 - (i) Alh. Oladimeji Dauda - Commissioner, for Works and Transport; and
 - (ii) Mr. O.O. Oyedele - Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Works and Transport

The Commissioner informed the House that cutting roads were being undertaken by Electricity and Water Providers and lately Telecommunication Companies.

He explained that, the Ministry used to entertain applications from these Organizations and give approval with instruction that the road be restored to its former status and equally charge fee on per meter ratio for this services to generate revenue for the State.

The Commissioner drew the attention of the House to the project for the upgrading of Water Supply System in Ibadan. He said, it was being done through use of the road right-of-way that included major areas in the Ibadan metropolis, such as Mokola, Oja-Oba e.t.c. the MTN had also being laying its optical fibre cable in phases. Phase one of the project was already on-going. The House observed that the Ministry did not address the issue of road cutting adequately but rather what they intended to do. By leave of the House, the Ministry was asked to go back and address the issue adequately and re-appear before the House on Tuesday, 6th December, 2016 to brief the House on steps and measures they had taken to ensure easy transportation and safety of commuters and motorists.

The Officials were asked to take three bows and leave.

8.0 SECOND READING OF OYO STATE RESIDENTS REGISTRATION AGENCY BILL 2015

Motion made and question proposed "that a Bill for a Law to Establish The Oyo State Residents' Registration Agency and For Connected Purposes be Read the Second Time" – Hon. K.H. Subair (Ibadan South-West I), Majority Leader.

Motion seconded by Hon. J.O. Ojo (Oriire) Minority Leader.

Debate Arising:

Question put and agreed to.

Bill accordingly read a Second Time and referred to Committees on Judiciary and Justice, Establishment & Training and Special Duties Development for further scrutiny.

9.0 REPORT OF A TWO-DAY REGIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE ROLE OF LEGISLATORS' IN THE ACHIEVEMENT OF SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS (SDGS) IN SOUTH WEST NIGERIA

The House received the Report of a two-day Regional Conference On The Role Of Legislators' In the Achievement of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGS) In South West Nigeria as presented by Hon. K.H. Subair (Ibadan South-West I), Majority Leader.

Motion made, "that the Report as presented be adopted – Hon. A. Musah (Saki-West), Deputy Speaker.

Motion seconded by Hon. J. Oyebamiji (Akinyele I).

Debate Arising:

Question put and agreed to.

Resolved: as follows that:

- (i) the Executive Arm of government be urged to take ownership of the SDGS with a view to further aligning it with existing State Development Plans in the immediate, short and long term towards making the lives of the people of our Pace Setter- State better;
- (ii) the Executive Arm of Government through the Ministry of Information, Broadcasting Corporation of Oyo State (BCOS), Local Government Information Officers and other information disseminating organs of Government in collaboration with the Private Sector and Civil Societies to ensure that the poor advocacy experienced in the implementation of the MDGS which is linked to poor knowledge and outcomes of the MDGS should be avoided in the implementation of the SDGS;
- (iii) the Executive Arm of Government to furnish the House of Assembly with detailed information on the extent of SDGS implementation in the State within two weeks;
- (iv) the Members of the House be commended for the smooth passage of Violence Against Women Law, 2016 and also to fast track the passage of the Disability and Physically Challenged Persons Bill, 2016, being prerequisites for assessing SDGS grant by our Pace Setter State;
- (v) the House Committees be urged to be SDG compliant, to request for regular updates from relevant MDAS and focal officials for tracking purpose; and
- (vi) the Members of the House be urged to tailor Constituency Projects towards the actualization of SDGS.

10.0 NEED TO ADDRESS THE MENACE OF INDISCRIMINATE CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATION OF PETROL STATIONS IN DANGER PRONE AND HAZARDOUS LOCATIONS ACROSS THE STATE:

Motion made, "that Government be urged to address the Menace Of Indiscriminate Construction And Operation Of Petrol Stations In

Danger Prone And Hazardous Locations Across The State - Hon. S.O. Ajanaku (Ibadan South-West II), Chairman, Parliamentary Council
Motion seconded by Hon. M.A. Wahab (Oluyole).

Resolved: accordingly as follows, "that the Executive Arm of Government through the Ministry of Lands, Urban Development and Physical Planning:

- (i) ensure that Petrol Stations in the States are constructed and operated in compliance with required standards; and
- (ii) ensure that the Management of Petrol Stations who contravene Town Planning Laws are sanctioned accordingly.
