**5.0 REPORT OF A TWO-DAY CAPACITY BUILDING ON THE ROLES OF PARLIAMENTS IN SECURITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ORGANIZED FOR PLATEAU AND OYO STATES HOUSES OF ASSEMBLY ON 9<sup>TH</sup> AND 10<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER, 2016 AT STEFFAN HOTEL, JOS, PLATEAU STATE**

House received the Report of the Capacity Building Training Programme attended by the Principal Officers of the House as presented by Hon. Abdul-Wasi Musah (Saki-West), Deputy Speaker.

Motion made "that the House do receive the Report as presented by the leader of the delegation - Hon. K.H. Subair (Ibadan South-West I), Majority Leader.

Motion seconded by Hon. G.J. Oyekola (Atiba), LP Whip.

Question put and agreed to.

Debate Arising:

Question that Recommendation be adopted put and agreed to.

**Resolved** as follows:

- (A) That the Oyo State House of Assembly should:
  - (i) charge its Committee on Public Account, Finance and Appropriation to monitor closely through Oversight Function, the performances of all revenue generating agencies, including the Board of Internal Revenue with a view to boosting the revenue accruing to the State's Coffer ;
  - (ii) Consider domesticating the Freedom Of Information Act (FOIA) with a view to making the business of governance more transparent;

- (iii) Rally round the proposed Financial Autonomy Bill under consideration. This would guarantee more fund for its business and bolster its integrity as an Arm of Government;
- (iv) Consider partnering with reputable Civil Society Organisations and recognized Non-Governmental Organizations that could assist in their legislative businesses especially Budget Packaging and Auditing;
- (v) Mandate its Committee on Public Accounts, Finance and Appropriation to initiate a Bill that would make the Board of Internal Revenue to be autonomous and self accounting entity;
- (vi) Note that Budgeting is a serious business; it is the heartbeat of the economy and the survival of the citizenry. Its packaging, implementation and auditing must be given all the seriousness it deserved if we are desirous of reversing the misfortunes previous years and sets the stated on the path of real recovery;
- (vii) Note, it is imperative that Oyo State House of Assembly to embrace public participation in budgeting process through public hearing or the economic routable to receive inputs from the electorates ;
- (viii) Consider that the proposed public participating should start with the Year 2017 budget proposals. It is therefore, recommended that the modalities for public participation should be worked out by the Committee on Public Accounts, Finance and Appropriation;
- (ix) Rejig its security arrangement with a view to put a stop to incessant burglary of Offices
- (x) Strengthens its various Committees with necessary logistics to carryout oversight of M.D.As and
- (xi) Should convey the appreciation to the Plateau State House of Assembly for the warm hospitality accorded the OYHA delegation during their stay in Jos and to the country representatives of KAS for extending the invitation to the OYHA to be part of the training.

(B) that the Executive Arm of the State Government should:

- (i) Be commended for its genuity in ensuring that the State stay afloat during this recession time. The State Government should however, ensure that on-going diversification of the economy are implemented with human face coupled with palliative measure to alleviate recession's hardship on the people of the State ;
- (ii) Strengthen its Security Outfit "Operation Burst" with more operational vehicles and modern gadgets to enable them cope with emerging security challenges ;
- (iii) Consider installing CCTV Camera at strategic locations in our Urban Centres for detection and apprehension of crimes;
- (iv) Collaborates with the traditional, religious, community leaders including the Chairmen of landlord and ladies Association to bolster its security arrangement;
- (v) Strengthen the mediation centre in the Ministry of Justice with necessary logistic to consolidate its status as an alternative dispute resolution;
- (vi) Do more with revenue collection by bringing in the informal sectors into tax net;
- (vii) Put in place, measure to motivate tax payers in the State such as transparency and accountability, tax payers rights charter; timely publication of Government receipt and expenses; engaging with domestic policy communities working on taxation and local media; and making revenue generating sources of government less cumbersome (e.g. Certificate of Occupancy c/o);
- (viii) Promote investments in private enterprises that can earn streams of regular income so that part of annual profits of such commercial companies will come into the treasury; and
- (ix) Not be discriminatory in bringing to book fraudulent revenue staff and non-compliant tax payers.

(C) that the National Assembly:

- (i) In conjunction with the Revenue Mobilization and Fiscal Allocation Commission (RMFAC) should revisit without delay the revenue sharing formula in favour of States and Local Governments; and
- (ii) Expedite action on the proposed amendment of the 1999 Constitution with a view to amending the Sections and Schedules that are hampering the economic growth of States and Local Government .

**6.0 NEED TO ENCOURAGE THE TEACHING OF HISTORY IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN THE STATE**

Motion made: that this House takes a critical look at the neglect of the teaching of history in Secondary Schools in spite of its importance and relevance to human development with a view to resuscitating the subject to add value to our educational system in the State – Hon. O.A. Oyatokun (Afijio), Deputy Majority Leader.

Motion seconded by Hon. B.S. Badmos (Akinyele II)

Question that the Motion be considered put and agreed to.

Debate Arising:

By leave of the House, the Committee on Education, Science and Technology was mandated to engage the Ministry of Education to ascertain the present status of the teaching of History subject in public Secondary Schools in the State and report to the House in one week.
