3.0 **APPROVAL OF VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS:**

On page 2 item 2.1, (xxvi) "A.P.C." was deleted and replaced with "L.P." Motion made, "That the Votes and Proceedings of Wednesday, 8th February, 2017 as amended be adopted" – Hon. K.H. Subair (Ibadan South-West I), Majority Leader.

Motion seconded by Hon. J. O. Ojo (Oriire), Minority Leader.

Question put and agreed to.

Resolved: accordingly in the affirmative.

4.0 **MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE:**

Mr. Speaker read the contents of a correspondence Ref. No. Gov. 2017/05/61 dated 7th February, 2017 authored by His Excellency, Senator Abiola Ajimobi titled: "Re: Federal Government Special Fertilizer Intervention Programme for All States of the Federation in 2017 Wet Farming Season". The letter sought the approval of the House for the State Government to secure an Irrevocable Standing Payment Order (ISPO) to participate in the Special Fertilizer Intervention Programme.

Debate Arising.

Motion made "that the House do approve the request of His Excellency to guarantee the State's participation in the Federal Government Special Fertilizer Intervention Programme in view of the fact that the planting session is around the corner – Hon. S.A. Olalere (Ido).

Motion seconded Hon. K.H. Subair (Ibadan South-West I), Majority Leader.

Question put and agreed to.

Resolved: accordingly in the affirmative.

5.0 ANNOUNCEMENT:

- (i) Mr. Speaker enjoined all Honourable Members to always attend Plenary Sittings punctually.
- (ii) Hon. Members were implored to attend the official commissioning of the newly refurbished Mace Platform, at the frontage of the Assembly Complex by His Excellency, Senator Abiola Ajimobi, immediately after the day's Sitting.

6.0 SECOND READING OF BILLS:

(i) **OYO STATE INSPECTION, GRADING AND MOVEMENT OF PRODUCE BILL, 2016**

Motion made and question proposed, "That A Bill For A Law To Provide For The Inspection, Grading And Movement Of Produce Within And Outside Oyo State And To Make Provisions For Other Matters Connected Therewith be read the **SECOND TIME** - Hon. K.H. Subair (Ibadan South West I), Majority Leader.

Motion seconded by Hon. J.O. Ojo (Oriire).

Debate Arising.

Question put and agreed to.

Bill accordingly read the Second Time and referred to the Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources for further scrutiny and report to the House within three weeks.

(ii) **OYO STATE PROCEEDINGS (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2016**

Motion made and question proposed, "That A Bill For A Law To Amend The State Proceedings Law, 1990 be read the **SECOND TIME** - Hon. K.H. Subair (Ibadan South-West I), Majority Leader. Motion seconded by Hon. J.O. Ojo (Oriire), Minority Leader.

Debate Arising.

Motion made "that in view of the need for more Legislative input and research, the Bill should be deferred till the next Legislative Day" - Hon. S.O. Ajanaku (Ibadan South-West II), Chairman, Parliamentary Council

By leave of the House, debate on the Bill was deferred to the next Plenary Sitting.

7.0 PRESENTATION OF REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON WORKS AND TRANSPORT

House received the Report of the Committee on Works and Transport on the Assessment of Operational Readiness of the Oyo State Fire Services as presented by the Chairman – Hon. M.A. Sangodipe (Saki East/Atisbo),

Motion made "That the House do adopt the Report as presented by the Chairman for debate" - Hon. K.H. Subair (Ibadan South-West I), Majority Leader.

Motion seconded by Hon. J.O. Ojo (Oriire), Minority Leader.

Debate Arising.

Question put and agreed to.

Resolved: accordingly as follows, "that

- (i) the Executive Governor, Senator Abiola Ajimobi, should be commended for approving the necessary fund for the repair of six fire tenders and purchase of chemicals for fire-fighting operations;
- (ii) the Fire Services Training School should be given necessary facelift with modern equipment and information technology in view of the strategic roles it is playing for various fire services organizations nation-wide;
- (iii) the staff be sponsored for both local and International trainings to avail them the newest methods of fire prevention and fire-fighting techniques;
- (iv) the Executive Arm of Government through the office of the Head of Service and Bureau of Establishments and Training should as a matter of urgency set up necessary machinery for the recognition and treatment of the Oyo State Fire Services as a paramilitary organization; the Department can be made to operate as an Arm of the State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA) under the Governors' office.
- (v) that the Government should adopt the salary and organizational structures and scheme of service of the Federal Fire Services as deemed appropriate for the State;
- (vi) that the welfare package of the officers and men of the Oyo State Fire Services be reviewed upwards. For instance the Shift Duty should be 25% of their basic salary per month and Hazard Allowance should be reviewed from its present N50 to 15% of their basic salary per month. There should also be uniform maintenance allowance of 10% of their basic salary per month;

- (vii) that the fuel dump at the Fire Service Headquarters be resuscitated to enhance rapid response to distress calls;
- (viii) that the moribund fire hydrants across the states be revived and be made to be running with water for easy accessibility during emergencies;
- (ix) that the State Tertiary and Secondary schools be encouraged to form Fire Service Clubs so as to be familiar with fire prevention methods;
- (x) the Control Room being a strategic room in the mobilization of Firemen and equipment to the scene of an accident and for receiving feedback should be rehabilitated to an International standard;
- (xi) members of the public should regularly be sensitized on fire prevention measures.
- (xii) the Executive Arm should consider having an Emergency Trust Fund for Oyo State Fire Services to guarantee regular funding of its Services.
- (xiii) ensure that the moribund fire hydrants scattered across the State are revived and be made to be running with water to enhance rapid response to distress calls;
- (ix) ensure that the State Tertiary and Secondary Schools are encouraged to form Fire Service Clubs so as to be familiar with fire prevention methods.
- (x) ensure that the Control Room being a strategic room in the mobilization of Firemen and equipment to the scene of an incident and for receiving feedback should be rehabilitated to meet up with International standard;
- (xi) ensure that members of the public are regularly sensitized on fire prevention measures;
- (xii) consider having an Emergency Trust Fund for Oyo State Fire Services to guarantee regular funding of its Services;
- (xiii) fashion out a way whereby the 33 Local Government Councils and 35 Local Councils Development Authority in the State would contribute to the running of the Fire Service;
- (xiv) approve the purchase of vital equipment necessary for an improved service and build more fire stations to reduce response time during emergencies; and
- (xv) consider as a matter of urgency, the recruitment of able bodied men and women.

8.0 **NEEDS TO SAVE LADOKE AKINTOLA UNIVERSITY
OF TECHNOLOGY TEACHING HOSPITAL, OGBOMOSO AND ITS
OUTREACH CENTRE, OYO FROM ULTIMATE COLLAPSE**

Motion made, "That this Honourable House deliberates on the poor state of the human and maternal resources at the Ladoke Akintola University Teaching Hospital, Ogbomosho and its Outreach Centre, Oyo which have adversely affected provision of quality health care services for which they were established. The Executive arm of government through the Ministry of Health be enjoined to take proactive measures for adequate staffing and provision of medical equipment in the Hospitals" - Hon. (Mrs.) B.O. Oladeji (Ogbomosho North)

Motion seconded by Hon. O.A. Oyatokun (Afijio), Deputy Majority Leader.

Question that the Motion be debated put and agreed to.

Debate Arising.

By Mr. Speaker order, Committee on Health was mandated to expedite action on the Subject matter taking into cognizance the prayers contained in the Motion and present its report before the House within two weeks.

9.0 **NEED FOR PROACTIVE STEP TO ADDRESS THE HIKE IN
PRICE OF AGRICULTURAL GOODS AND FOOD STUFFS**

Motion made, "That this Honourable House examines the incessant hike in Price Of Food Stuffs in our Major Markets in the State with a view to appealing to relevant government Agencies and other Stakeholders to take necessary measures to address the challenge" - Hon. (Mrs.) B.O. Agbaje (Ibadan North I)

Motion seconded by Hon. L.O. Balogun (Oorelope).

Question that the Motion be adopted put and agreed to.

Debate Arising.

Question put and agreed to.

Resolved: accordingly as follows, "that

(i) The Executive Arm of the State Government:

(a) through the Ministry of Trade, Investment and Cooperatives, convene an emergency meeting of stakeholders i.e. all Traders Association in the State to address the incessant increase in the price of food stuffs;

(b) through the Ministry of Agriculture and Natural Resources, establish silos in the three Senatorial Districts for the storage of Agricultural products and sale at controlled price; and

- (c) through the Ministry of Local Government and Chieftaincy Matters, direct the Local Governments in the State to revive farmers market so that the farmers can sell their farm produce directly to the retailer and final consumers.
- (ii) the Federal Government through the Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development and the State Government to consider the re-introduction of Commodity Marketing Board to boost Agricultural Production and Intensify effort to encourage Local Farmers to increase locally produced goods.
