Mr. Speaker announced that:

(i) the Committee on Public Petitions, Human Rights, Ethics and Privileges would meet immediately after Plenary Sitting in the Inner Chamber.

(ii) Members were reminded to prepare and attend the Plenary Sitting on Thursday, 27th April, 2017 with circulated documents for the appearance of the Special Adviser on Revenue Matters, Commissioners and Permanent Secretaries, Ministries Lands, Urban Development and Finance and Budget.

6.0 **THIRD READING OF FIRES SERVICES (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2016:**

- (i) House received the Report of the Committee on Works and Transport that considered Fire Services (Amendment) Bill, 2016 as presented by the the Chairman, Hon. M.A. Sangodipe (Saki East/Atisbo).

Motion made “that the House do receive the Report as presented for debate” - Hon. O. A. Oyatokun (Afijio), Deputy Majority Leader. Motion seconded by Hon. J. O. Ojo (Oriire) Minority Leader.

Question put and agreed to.

Resolved: accordingly in the affirmative.

- (ii) Motion made, “that this House do constitute itself into Committee of the Whole House to consider the Report of the Committee on Works and Transport on the Fire Services (Amendment) Bill, 2016” – Hon. O. A. Oyatokun (Afijio), Deputy Majority Leader.

Motion seconded by Hon. J. O. Ojo (Oriire) – Minority Leader.

Question put and agreed to.

Resolved: accordingly in the affirmative.

IN THE COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE:

Long Title: Question that Long Tittle Stand Part of the Bill put and agreed to.

Clause 1: Question, that Clause 1 stand part of the Bill put and agreed to.

Clause 2: Amendment proposed that a new Clause 2 be inserted to read thus: “The Principal Law” means the Fire Service Law, 1960.

Question, that Clause 2 as amended stand part of the Bill put and agreed to.

Clause 3: Amendment proposed that former Clause 2 becomes Clause 3 and in line 5, the letter “a” be expunged after the word “include”

Question, that Clause 3 as amended stand part of the Bill put and agreed to.

Clause 4: Amendment proposed that former Clause 3 becomes Clause 4 and read thus:

(i) in “6F” line “4” the figure “~~₦~~200,000.00” be deleted and replaced with “~~₦~~100,000.00”

(ii) in “6H” (3) line “5” the figure “~~₦~~50,000.00” be deleted and replaced with “~~₦~~30,000.00” and delete “6” before “month” in line 6 and replace with “3” and renumber last paragraph of Clause 3 as Clause 4.

Question, that Clause 4 as amended stand part of the Bill put and agreed to.

Clause 5: Amendment to Section 17 of the Principal Law be number as Clause 5 and in line “4” the figure “~~₦~~50,000.00” be deleted and replaced with “~~₦~~200,000.00” and “6” month be deleted and replaced with “1year” after the word “exceeding”

Question, that Clause 5 as amended stand part of the Bill put and agreed to.

Clause 6: Amendment proposed that New Clause 6 be inserted as amendment to Section 18 of the Principal Law and to read thus: the word “fifty naira” be deleted and replaced with “Twenty thousand Naira (N20, 000.00)” in line 4 after the word “exceeding”

Question, that new Clause 6 stand part of the Bill put and agreed to.

Clause 7: Amendment proposed that a new Clause 7 be inserted as amendment to Section 21(2) of the Principal Law and to read thus:

the word “one Hundred Naira” be deleted and replaced with “Fifty Thousand Naira (N50, 000.00)” in “4”

Question, that new Clause 7 stand part of the Bill put and agreed to.

7.0 NEED TO STOP THE GROSS ABUSE OF PUBLIC/GOVERNMENT PROPERTIES IN OYO STATE

Motion made, "that this Honourable House critically discuss the misuse and the resultant damaging of public properties with a view to remedying the inappropriate attitude and save government

expenditure on unnecessary repairs” – Hon. Gbenga Oyekola (Atiba), Party Whip.

Motion seconded by Hon. (Mrs.) B.O. Oladeji (Ogbomoso North).

Debate Arising.

Question put and agreed to.

Resolved: accordingly as follows: “that this Honourable House:

- (i) urge the Executive Arm of Government through:
 - (a) the Ministry of Environment and Water Resources to enforce law on environmental sanitation in the State;
 - (b) the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology to mandate Heads of Schools and Governing Boards to ensure safety and proper maintenance of Schools buildings, furniture and equipment and any person caught damaging School properties should be brought to book;
 - (c) the Ministry of Health to mandate all hospital administrators to ensure safety, proper use and maintenance of medical facilities and equipment and any staff caught mishandling or stealing medical equipment should be dealt with according to the civil service rules.
 - (d) Ministry of Information, Culture and Tourism to device effective means to educate and sensitize the public on the need to protect public properties from being damaged;
- (ii) call on the Traffic Division of the Nigeria Police, Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC), Oyo State Road Traffic Management Authority (OYRTMA), National Union of Road Transport Workers (NURTW) and Road Transport Employers Association (RTEA) to enforce the relevant provisions of road traffic law to ensure free flow of traffic and discourage illegal parking along the road sides on our major roads and highways;
- (iii) call on all print and electronic media to embark on sensitization programmes in form of jingles or advertisement on the proper use of public properties and the need to desist from any act that can damage them;
- (iv) call on relevant Government Agencies, especially Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) and Oyo State Road Maintenance Authority (OYRTMA) to remove all damaged and abandoned vehicles lying on the major roads and highways to allow free flow of traffic; and
- (v) mandate the relevant Standing Committees of the House especially on Education, Health, Environment, Works and Transport and Special Duties to as a matter of duty regularly monitor the use of public properties under their purview.
