3.0 **APPROVAL OF VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS:**

Mr. Speaker announced that he had examined the Votes and Proceedings of Tuesday, 25th April, 2017 and called for comments.

Motion made, "That the Votes and Proceedings of Tuesday, 25th April, 2017 be adopted" – Hon. K.H. Subair (Ibadan South-West I), Majority Leader.

Motion seconded by Hon. J. O. Ojo (Oriire), Minority Leader.

Question put and agreed to.

Resolved: accordingly in the affirmative.

4.0 **APPEARANCE BEFORE THE HOUSE**

Pursuant to the Resolution of the House on Tuesday, 11th April, 2017, the following Government Officials appeared before the House and briefed the House on measures being adopted to meet their revenue target for the State in the Fiscal Year 2017:

- (i) Mr. Abimbola Adekanmbi - Commissioner for Finance and Budget;
- (ii) D.O. Olatunde – Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Finance and Budget;
- (iii) Mr. Isaac Ajiboye Omodewu – Commissioner, Ministry of Lands, Housing and Survey;
- (iv) Alhaji B. T. Oladipo - Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Lands, Housing and Survey; and
- (v) Mr. Adebisi Oloko - Special Adviser to the Governor on Revenue Matters;

The Officials were put on Oath and fielded questions from the Honourable Members on measures being taken or adopted to meet their revenue target.

- (i) In his presentation, the Special Adviser on Revenue Matters, Mr. Adebisi Oloko submitted that Revenue Board was moving from civil service structure to a private sector driven service. He added that the Board had put in place measures to realize the projected revenue for 2017 and some of these measures were:
- (a) recruitment of qualified personnel to man various post and officers throughout the States;
 - (b) blockage of cash leakages;
 - (c) the remuneration of staff to be performance based;
 - (d) generation of revenue from informal sector;
 - (e) tax net being expanded to bring multi-national Companies into it and the discouragement of tax evasion; and
 - (f) the auditing of Companies to discover their actual staff strength for the purpose of collection of pay-as-you-earn taxes.

He advocated for a shift in the revenue paying attitude of the tax payer to be voluntary.

- (ii) Commissioner for of Lands Housing and Survey, Chief Isaac Ajiboye Omodewu informed the House as follows:
that the Ministry had a number of GRAs that could bring in more revenue if some infrastructures were put in place, like payment of compensation to land owners and the full payment of fees by allottees. The Commissioner put the number of GRA in the State at seven and amount being expected as revenue at Ten Billion, Seven Hundred and Four Million and Four Hundred and Sixty Thousand Naira.

The GRAs are located:

- (a) behind Adeoyo State Hospital, Ring Road, Ibadan;
- (b) at Ile-Igbon along Ibadan/Iwo Road, Ibadan;
- (c) along Oyo/Ibadan Expressway;
- (d) Oyo;
- (e) Ogbomosho;
- (f) Iseyin; and
- (g) Saki.

The Commissioner identified other sources as sale of government quarters, mortgage, sub lease, land use charge, home owners charges which could generate about Twenty Billion Naira.

(iii) The Commissioner for Finance and Budget, Mr. Abimbola Adekanmbi informed the House that the Ministry during the Budget preparation adopted zero based Budgeting system. This would go a long way to improve the revenue of most of the revenue generating Agencies. He said that the Ministry had recommended measures to be adopted for the budget to be self-reliant and His Excellency had approved the measures. Some of these measures were:

- (i) Budget implementation Committee to monitor the performance of the budget on monthly basis;
- (ii) Consideration for approval of fund request to be based on percentage of revenue generated by the Ministry requesting for fund;
- (iii) Priority to be given to revenue generating projects; and
- (iv) tapping into the effort of Development partners.

The Commissioner rounded up by commending the House for their effort at moving the State forward.

The Honourable Members charged the Agencies to be more proactive on the measures and adopt practical efforts that will aid realization of their revenue targets.

By leave of the House, the Committee on Public Accounts, Finance and Appropriation was directed to take regularly engage the revenue generating MDAs and report to the House.

By leave of the House, Motion on the need to consolidate the agricultural initiative of Oyo State Government through tractors distributed to some local government and prevent it from collapse by Hon. J.O. Olaleru (Kajola), Deputy Chief Whip was deferred till next Sitting.
