SURVEY (FURTHER AMENDMENT) BILL, 2018

- (c) after the definition of the words 'Chief Medical Examiner' insert "Commissioner means the Commissioner in the Ministry of Health"

Re-write Clause 4 (1) as follows:

4 (1) (b) re-couch the side notes as "Appointment and qualification of Chief Medical Examiner"; and

4 (2) in line two expunge "but shall be eligible" after the word "years" and replaced with "may be considered"

In sub-clause 4(2) line 3 expunge "at the discretion of the Commissioner"

7.0 NEED TO BEEF UP SECURITY IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS THROUGH EMPLOYMENT OF SECURITY GUARDS TO FILL THE VACANCIES CREATED BY THOSE THAT HAVE RETIRED

Motion made “that this Honourable House deliberate on the large vacancies created by the retirement of Security Guards in Public Schools and its security implication with a view to appealing to the Executive Arm of Government to fill the vacancies through new employment to safeguard government properties in the Schools” – Hon. J. Oyebamiji (Akinyele I) and Hon. M. A. Wahab (Oluyole).

Motion seconded by Hon. O.S. Akande (Ogbomoso South).

Question that the Motion be taken put and agreed to.

The title was amended to read “Need to Beef Up Security in Public Schools”.

Debate Arising.

Question put and agreed to.

Resolved: accordingly as follows, “that:

the Executive Arm of Government through the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology, Teaching Service Commission and State Universal Basic Education Board (SUBEB) be urged to:

- (i) employ day and night guards for all public schools in the State to fill the vacancies in the guards cadre;
- (ii) collaborate with Security Organizations such as the Nigeria Police and the National Security and Civil Defence Corps to complement security arrangement in public schools;
- (iii) ensure that school buildings are well secured with burglar proof especially laboratories and technical workshops;
- (iv) construct wall fence round public schools in the State;

- (v) mandate the school authorities to ensure regular clearing of bushes in and around the schools;
- (vi) applaud Schools Governing Board (SGB) and charge them to rise to the security challenges in their various schools;
- (vii) commend the Old Student's Associations of various Schools for their numerous laudable projects they were executing in the Schools while equally urging them to come to the aid of schools in respect of security.

8.0 **ADJOURNMENT:**

“That this Honourable House do now adjourn till Tuesday, 26th June, 2018 at 10.00 a.m. - Hon. K.H. Subair (Ibadan South-West I), Majority Leader.

COMMENT UNDER ADJOURNMENT:

Mr. Speaker announced that Sunday, 10th of June would be the 3rd year anniversary of the 8th Assembly of this Honourable House. He congratulated the whole House and went further to list the Assembly's achievements from 10th June, 2015 – 7th June, 2018 as follows:

(i) Law Making

The eighth Assembly he said has been proactive in its activities and had passed into law a total of 54 Bills, while 22 are at various stages of consideration. Out of the 76 Bills being considered, 20 of them were private members Bills on Health, Education, Security and Agriculture. Some of the obsolete Laws were reviewed and amended, one of which established 35 Local Council Development Areas.

(ii) Confirmation Of Statutory Appointment

(iii) Oversight Functions

(iv) Quasi-Judicial Functions

(v) Human Capacity Development: Honourable Members and Staff had the opportunity to attend human capacity training organized by NGO, Konrad Adenauer Stiftung (KAS),

(vi) Empowerment Programmes: Honourable Members engaged in several programmes like sponsoring youths in learning of some trade (ICT, Hairdressing, Barbing, Fashion designing) and provision of working tools after freedom, assisting farmers with chemicals, improved seedlings and finance, assisting traders with fund to boost their businesses amongst others.

CHALLENGES:

He identified paucity of fund as a major challenge facing the House as it has affected it in the performance of its oversight functions. That also coupled with inadequate skilled manpower and working tools.

CONCLUSION:

He concluded by giving the Almighty God the glory for the modest achievement in the last three years and expressed the resolve of the House to continue to enact laws for the peace, order, growth and development of Oyo State.
