Motion made and question proposed that "A Bill For A Law To Repeal The Coroner's Law Cap 36 Laws Of Oyo State, 2000 And Enact The Oyo State Coroner's Law To Regulate The Appointment, Powers And Duties Of Coroners And Other Matters Related Thereto be read the **SECOND TIME**" - Hon. K. H. Subair (Ibadan South-West I) Majority Leader.

Bill accordingly read a **Second Time** and referred to Joint Committee on Health and Judiciary and Justice for further consideration and report to the House.

7.0 **COMMITTEE REPORT:**

The Report Of The Joint Committee On Local Government, Chieftaincy Matters And State Honours And Security And Strategy that investigated the gruesome murder of a SARS Officer In Saki By Suspected Herdsmen was presented by Hon. G. J. Oyekola (Atiba) on behalf of the Joint Committee.

Motion made, "that the House do adopt the Report of the The Joint Committee On Local Government, Chieftaincy Matters And State Honours And Security And Strategy as presented for debate" - Hon. K.H Subair (Ibadan SouthWestI), MajorityLeader.

Motion seconded by Hon. J. O. Ojo (Oriire), Minority Leader.

Question put and agreed to

Debate arising.

Question that the recommendations be adopted put and agreed to.

Resolved: accordingly as follows, "that:

- (i) this Honourable House should fastrack the process of passing into Law the Livestock Open Rearing and Grazing Regulation Bill, 2018 to curb the activities of the killer herdsmen;
- (ii) the State Police Command should step up their intelligence gathering with a view to fish out the remaining culprits that participated in the killing of ASP Sheu Magu with a view to bringing them to justice;
- (iii) the Executive Arm of Government should consider giving financial assistance to the family of late ASP Sheu Magu to mitigate their sorrow;
- (iv) the Oyo State Chapter of the Association of Local Government of Nigeria

(ALGON) should put up request to the Chairman, Oyo State Security Trust Fund (OYSSTF) for financial and logistic assistance to registered Local Government Vigilante;

- (v) the Federal Government should as a matter of urgency find lasting solution to frequent crisis associated with violence involving herdsmen and farmers in Nigeria with a view to understanding reasons for the escalation of violence, identify the key actors and elements fuelling the crisis;
- (vi) the farming community in Oyo State especially those involved in animal husbandry should be encouraged through policy measures to invest in the establishment of modern ranches;
- (vii) the Federal Government should invest more in nomadic education, establish more schools for the nomads and provide more infrastructures in their various settlements nationwide;
- (viii) the Federal Government, through the Ministry of Interior should put in place a method of monitoring Nigeria border lines to check the activities of international terrorists and cattle rustlers, economic saboteurs and other criminal-minded individuals or groups;
- (ix) the Oyo State Police Command should impress it on their Divisional Police Officers to attend the Local Government Security meetings and give priority attention to herdsmen menace with a view to give necessary protection to the lives and properties of the people;
- (x) the Federal Government in conjunction with the National Assembly should take advantage of the prevailing massive call and support for the constitutional amendment to grant State the autonomy to establish their own Police Organization. This will go a long way in addressing security lapses and
- (xi) the Thirty-Three (33) Local Government Councils and Thirty-Five (35) Local Council Development Areas (LCDAs) should provide logistics for Vigilante within their local areas for effective surveillance.
