5.0 PERSONAL EXPLANATION:

- (i) Hon. Samuel Olusegun Ajanaku (Ibadan South-West II), Chairman, Parliamentary Council drew the attention of the House to the birthday of Hon. Bolaji Saheed Badmos (Akinyele II). He traced his origin to the Famous Badmos Family in Akinyele Local Government. Hon. Ajanaku said he is an astute businessman having managed family business both in Nigeria and abroad and provided about one thousand jobs for youths in Akinyele Local Government.

- (ii) Hon.
