Mr. Speaker read the content of a Petition titled “Invation, Eating And Destruction of our Rice Farm Site at Ilero by the Fulani Herdsmen” authored by Anfani Area (Ibadan) Ire-Oluwa Farmers’ Multipurpose Cooperative Society dated 20th December, 2017.

The Petition was referred to the Committee on Public Petitions and Human Rights for consideration and report back to the House.

8.0 URGENT NEED TO MAKE JUDICIOUS USE OF LOCK UP SHOPS AND OPEN MARKET STALLS CONSTRUCTED BY SOME LOCAL GOVERNMENTS IN THE STATE TO AVOID WASTAGE OF TAX PAYERS’ MONEY

Motion made, “That this Honourable House take cognizance of lock-up shops constructed by some Local Governments which are lying fallow with a view to mandating the affected Local Governments to put in place measures that will ensure efficient use of the lock up shops for improved economic activities and revenue generation” – Rt. Hon. A.M. Adeyemo (Ibarapa East), Speaker, Hons. K.H. Subair (Ibadan South-West I),

Majority Leader, and A. Musah (Saki-West), Deputy Speaker – Co-Sponsors.

Motion seconded by Hon. A. K. Oloya (Ibadan North-East I).

Question, that the Motion be taken put and agreed to.

Resolved:

Prayer(i): Question that the House invite the Commissioner and Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Local Government and Chieftaincy Matters to appear before the House to give a comprehensive situation report on the state of lock up shops and open market stall in the affected Local Government Areas and Local Council Development Areas across the State with a view to ensuring effective utilization put and negatived.

Prayer (ii): Question that the Committee on Local Government, Chieftaincy Matgters and State Honours carry out oversight on the Local Government with unsued lock up shops and open market stalls and report to the House put and agreed to.

9.0 THIRD READING OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT (FURTHER AMENDMENT) BILL, 2017

By leave of the House, the Third Reading of Local Government (Further Amendment) Bill, 2017 was taken.

(i) House received the Report of the Committee on Local Government, Chieftaincy Matters and State Honours that considered the Local Government (Further Amendment) Bill, 2017 as presented by Hon. B.S. Badmos (Akinyele II), Chairman.

(ii) Motion made “that this House do constitute itself into the Committee of the Whole House to consider the Report, including recommendations of the Committee on Local Government, Chieftaincy Matters and State Honours that considered the Local Government (Further Amendment) Bill, 2017 – Hon. K. H. Subair (Ibadan South-West I), Majority Leader.

Motion seconded by Hon. G. J. Oyekola (Atiba), L.P Whip.

Question put and agreed to.

Resolved: accordingly in the affirmative.

COMMENT UNDER ADJOURNMENT:

Hon. S.O. Ajanaku (Ibadan South-West II), Chairman, Parliamentary Council commented on the scarcity of fuel which was becoming worrisome. He noted that the scarcity was artificial. This was due to the fact that marketers were hoarding the product with the view of selling above the approved rate. He thereafter, appealed to the fuel marketers to desist from hoarding the product, rather they should make fuel available in order to ease hardship being experienced at the festive period.
