7.0 MATTER OF URGENT PUBLIC IMPORTANCE:

Pursuant to Order VIII Rule (4) of the Standing Rules of Oyo State House of Assembly, Hon. G. J. Oyekola raised A Matter of Urgent Public Importance titled: “Urgent Need to Call on Federal Road Maintenance Agency (FERMA) To Rehabilitate The Bad Portion And Bridges Along Oyo – Ogbomoso Road. He drew the attention of the House to the deplorable condition of the road and the need for urgent rehabilitation.

Motion seconded by Hon. A.F. Adesina (Ibadan South East I)

Debate Arising:

Question that the motion be debated put and agreed to.

Resolved accordingly as follows:

“that the House write letters of appeal to the underlisted on the urgent need to rehabilitate and repair damaged roads and bridges on Oyo – Ogbomoso, Oyo - Ibadan, Oyo-Iseyin and Ibadan – Ife roads and other Federal roads within the State that are in deplorable condition:

- (i) The Honourable Minister, Federal Ministry of Works, Housing and Power;
- (ii) The Director, FERMA (South West)
- (iii) The Chairman , Senate Committee on Works;
- (iv) The Chairman, House of Representatives Committee on Works; and
- (v) All distinguished Senators and House of Representatives Members from Oyo State.

8.0 PERSONAL EXPLANATION:

Hon. O. O. Olaleye (Ibadan North II) drew the attention of the House to a widely circulated news item that alleged the sack of eight hundred (800) Oyo State workers. He claimed to have investigated the report in his capacity as the House Chairman of Committee on Employment, Labour, Productivity and Pension and found out that the news item was false. He further informed the House that the present administration had carried out verification of Trade Test Certificate of certain cadres within the State workforce. According to him, the issue had been resolved and names of the affected workers were back on the payroll of the State. He concluded by urging His Excellency, the Executive Governor of the State, Senator Abiola Ajimobi to fast track the payment of the arrears of salary of workers in the State from the recently released Paris fund.

- A. **Barrister Esther Akerele** was born on 4th April, 1968. She obtained her first and second degree (L.L.M) from Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife in 1997 and 2013 respectively. She was called to the bar in 1999 and she started her career in 2000 with S.S. Akinyele & Co. Awolowo, Ibadan. Also, she served as Legal consultant at Atisbo Local Government, Tede, Oyo State. She has to her credit several awards and had published many academic research works. She had held several positions as Legal Counsel to organisations of repute within Nigeria. She also held political appointment as Senior Special Assistant to the Governor on Special Duties between 2014 – 2015. She was found appointable as a Member of the Judicial Service Commission.

- B. **Barrister Salami, Ademola Rasheed** was born on 23rd October, 1969 from Iwajowa Local Government. He graduated from Ogun State University, Ago-Iwoye now Olabisi Onabanjo University in year 2002 where he bagged his L.L.B degree and later proceeded to the Nigeria Law School in 2002 and came out in 2003. He had his second degree from University of Ibadan in 2006 where he obtained his L.L.M. He started his career as Litigation Officer from Kunle Ishola and Co., Survey House, Orogun, Ibadan from 1993 – 1995. He started his career in 1964. He worked briefly as classroom teacher at Wesley College Practical School, Ibadan between 1970 – 1975. Before his nomination he had held key positions in many establishments. He was appointed as Special Adviser to the State Governor on Establishments and Training, Culture and Tourism between 2011- 2013 and Local Government and Chieftaincy Matters respectively, between 2014 – 2015. He was found appointable as the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission.
- (ii) **Mr. Ayankojo Babatunde Mutiu** was born on January, 5th 1971. He graduated from University of Ilorin, Kwara State in 2003 with B. A. (Hons), Performing Arts. He later proceeded to Oyo State College of Education, Oyo for his Diploma in Management Information System in 2007 and Ladoke Akintola University of Technology Ogbomoso for his master’s degree in Public Administration in 2015. He is a Senior Assistant Registrar at Emmanuel Alayande College of Education, Oyo. He had served as Secretary to various Committees within the College.
