3.0 **APPROVAL OF VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS:**

Mr. Speaker announced that he had examined the Votes and Proceedings of Tuesday, 19th September, 2017 and called for comments.

Motion seconded by Hon. G. J. Oyekola (Atiba), Labour Party Whip.

Question put and agreed to.

Resolved accordingly in the affirmative.

6.0 DIRECTIVES:

Mr. Speaker directed Committees handling various assignments of the House particularly, consideration of Bills to expedite action on such with a view to presenting their Reports for consideration at the House Plenary.

7.0 MATTERS OF URGENT PUBLIC IMPORTANCE:

Pursuant to Order VIII Rule (4) of the Standing Rules of the Oyo State House of Assembly, Hons K.H. Subair (Ibadan South-West I), Majority Leader and A.F. Adesina (Ibadan South-East I) raised a Matter of Urgent Public Importance on Gunmen Attack at Olubadan's Palace on Monday, 25th September, 2017. The sponsors of the Motion condemned in totality the despicable act and commended His Excellency, Senator Abiola Ajimobi who promptly rose to the occasion by ordering the arrest of the culprits.

By Mr. Speaker's order, the Nigeria Police Force was requested to promptly arrest and bring to justice those who masterminded the attack. The Olubadan in Council was also requested to sheath its sword while the Judiciary promptly bring the culprits to book.

8.0 PERSONAL EXPLANATIONS:

- (i) Hon. L.O. Balogun (Oorelope) drew the attention of the House to an advert in the **Nigerian Tribune** of Monday, 25th September, 2017 that eulogized a former Governor of Oyo State on the Governor's birthday. He dissociated himself as a signatory to the said publication.
- (ii) Hon. O.O. Olaleye (Ibadan North II) drew the attention of the House to the improved performance of Oyo State students in the 2017 West African Senior Secondary School Examinations. According to him, fifty-four percent (54%) of the students passed five subjects, inclusive of English and Mathematics, at credit levels. He commended His Excellency, Senator Abiola Ajimobi, the Executive Governor of the State for various policies that had made the performance achievable.

9.0 COMMITTEE REPORT:

The Report of the Committee on Public Accounts, Finance and Appropriation that interacted with the Ministries of Finance and Budget, Lands, Housing and Survey and State Board of Internal Revenue over Revenue generation in the State was presented by the Chairperson Hon. (Mrs.) B.O. Agbaje (Ibadan North I).

Motion made “that the House do receive the Report as presented by the Chairperson for debate” – Hon. K. H. Subair (Ibadan South–West I), Majority Leader.

Motion seconded by Hon. G. J. Oyekola (Atiba), Labour Party Whip.
Debate Arising.

Question put and agreed to.

The House consequently resolved as follows, “that;

- (i) the Board of Internal Revenue (BIR) should intensify efforts on revenue generation from PAYE of companies and the Federal Establishments Operating in the State through realistic database;
- (ii) the BIR should be urged to encourage periodic and persistent tax family meetings of all stakeholders to review and assess the revenue profile of the State with a view to solving and proffering solutions to revenue challenges;
- (iii) the BIR initiative on deployment of point-of-sale (POS) terminals to all revenue collection points should be sustained and monitored effectively. This will go a long way to blocking revenue leakages and eliminate cash collection at all revenue generating points;
- (iv) the Executive Arm of the State Government is advised to source inputs of experts and professionals from BIR on any Bills emanating from Ministry of Justice or MDAs that has to do with revenue generation before transmission to the House for legislative action;
- (v) the Ministry of Lands, Housing and Survey should be commended on its various strategic plans put in place to meet its revenue target in 2017. At the meeting with the Committee, the Ministry backed its claims with facts and figures of revenue details;
- (vi) the Ministry of Lands should concentrate more on the realization of 100% (percent) revenue generation from Land Use Charge and Home Owners’ Charter. The bulk of revenue is coming from these sources;

- (vii) as soon as the Money/Fund is released, the Ministry of Lands should fast track the mobilization of contractors to the sites i.e GRAs allocation of plots to intending buyers;
- (viii) this Honourable House should be urged to investigate the activities of all the consultants engaged by Government to collect revenue for all the revenue generating MDAs;
- (ix) the Executive Arm of Government should be urged to adopt the automation system of collecting revenue in all the Revenue generating Ministries, Departments and Agencies of government;
- (x) the Executive Arm of Government should consider adequate motivation of staff of the revenue generating MDAs;
- (xi) the Executive Arm of Government should implement the revenue Administration Law and promptly constituting the State Revenue Board; and
- (xii) the Executive Arm of Government to urgently address the shortage of manpower in the Ministry of Lands, Housing and Survey and the Office of the Surveyor General.

10.0 NEED TO APPEAL TO THE EXECUTIVE ARM OF GOVERNMENT OF OYO STATE TO APPROVE THE CONVERSION OF QUALIFIED NON-TEACHING STAFF IN PUBLIC SECONDARY SCHOOLS TO TEACHING STAFF TO FILL SOME VACANCIES

Motion made “That this Honourable House take cognizance of some non-teaching staff in Secondary Schools and other Public Servant with teaching qualification with a view to urging the Executive Arm to approve their conversion to teaching staff to fill some vacancies in the Public Secondary Schools – Hons J.A. Olaleru (Kajola), Deputy Chief Whip and G.J. Oyekola (Atiba) – Co-sponsors.

Motion seconded by Hon. O.A. Oyatokun (Afijio), Deputy Majority Leader.

Question that the Motion be taken put and agreed to.

Resolved accordingly “that

a passionate appeal be made to His Excellency, Senator Abiola Ajimobi a listening Governor to approve the conversion of some Non-Teaching Staff and other public servants with requisite qualifications to Teaching Staff in the State in order to fill the existing vacancies.

MATTER UNDER ADJOURNMENT:

Mr. Speaker observed that the day's Plenary Sitting was not conducive due to distractions and noise from protesting members of the National Union of Local Government Employees (NULGE) within the precinct of the House of Assembly. He further observed that in spite of several appeals from the Chief Whip and the Deputy Speaker that the noise be stemmed down, the noise persisted.

The Executive Members of NULGE were summoned to appear before the House to offer explanations on why the Union constituted themselves as nuisance within precinct of the House of Assembly. Their action infringed on the rights of the Legislature. Four executive members of NULGE appeared before the House and were made to realize that the action of their members portrayed total disrespect to the sanctity of the House. Honourable Members identified with the position of Mr. Speaker and urged him to temper justice with mercy. The NULGE Chairman apologized for the distraction and stressed the fact that its members hold the House in high esteem. He then promised they would put an end to the noise pollution.

Mr. Speaker assured them that members of the Union would be attended to immediately after the adjournment of the House. The executive members of the Union bowed to the House and were subsequently discharged.
